

AROUND WALKS



Frankby - "Hill Bark" - Stapledon Wood - Caldy - The Wirral Way - West Kirby Old Village -Larton - Royden Park - Frankby. Walking distance (6 miles).

This is a lovely walk passing 2 impressive mansions, 2 quiet villages and beautiful views of the Dee Estuary.

Parking at Royden Park, turn left into the driveway leading to "Hill Bark". Ignore the path leading off left to Thursaston Common, continuing forward towards the gates of the Hall for a further 30 yards.


- Now turn left into the trees, following the broad path into a picnic area. Go straight across into the trees opposite and drop down into a wide grassland. Crossing this area you will have a lovely view of the mansion on your right.
- Amazingly, "Hill Bark" once stood near the top of Bidston Hill (known as Bidston Court then). In This is a lovely walk passing 2 impressive mansions, 2 quiet villages and beautiful views of the Dee Estuary.
- Parking at Royden Park, turn left into the driveway leading to "Hill Bark". Ignore the path leading off left to Thursaston Common, continuing forward towards the gates of the Hall for a further 30 yards.
- Now turn left into the trees, following the broad path into a picnic area. Go straight across into the trees opposite and drop down into a wide grassland. Crossing this area you will have a lovely view of the mansion on your right.
- Amazingly, "Hill Bark" once stood near the top of Bidston Hill (known as Bidston Court then). In 1930, Sir Ernest Royden acquired the property and had the Hall carefully taken down - each beam and stone being carefully numbered - and reerected where you see it today!

Walking diagonally left (towards the trees) you will arrive at a tumbledown sandstone wall, do not cross but keep it on your left until you reach a wooden bachelor gate. Pass through, turn to the right and a short walk will bring you to Montgomery Hill. Go straight across the road and enter the broad sandy track opposite. This will take you through fields to the West Kirby-Heswall Road, where you turn right. Follow the road for a quarter of a mile, until you reach Grange Cross Lane, go straight across and follow the road uphill for 200 yards. Cross the road to a gap in the wall and flight of stone steps, this is the way into Stapleton Woods.

As you enter the woods, take the left fork of the path. Keep the old stone wall (what is left of it) on your left as you go forward. After about 10 minutes, you will arrive at steps which take you down to a path passing behind some houses. You very soon reach a wooden bachelor gate which brings you into Caldy Road. Here, your way is to the right following the windy road through Caldy Village.

Caldy, mentioned in the Doomesday Book as Calders, was described in the early part of the 19th Century as being "one of the worst villages in Wirral, consisting of a few fishermen's huts and miserable hovels." Fortunately, R W Barton changed all this when he bought the village and either rebuilt or renovated every house! What a beautiful village it is today!

Following Caldy Road as it bears to the right at the church, look out for a stone memorial in front of the church. Now cross the road to enter a path facing the

memorial. This path narrows to become a sandy track winding its way down to Croft Drive. Here you need to turn right, crossing Croft Drive West and carry on forward to reach the remains of a demolished railway bridge. Turn right here into Wirral Country Park. Follow the Wirral Way for 3/4 of a mile with the Dee on your left. Look ahead for a bridge and climb the steps on the right when you reach it, leading into York Avenue.

Now go forward into the old village of West Kirby, passing 2 Inns, the Moby Dick and the Ring O'Bells, following the road as it climbs towards Grange Beacon, a popular viewing beacon. To reach the Beacon, look right for some stone steps as you near the top of the road. Climb the steps and they take you to the column. There is a lovely view of West Kirby and Hilbre Island, then turn left along Column Road. When you reach the crossroads, turn right down Blackhorse Hill to reach the The Hilltop with a great selection of bar food at reasonable costs to enjoy. From The Hilltop, turn left and at the bottom of the hill cross into Saughall Massie Road. You will pass a school and then the fane winds it's way between fields to meet a lane signposted "Frankby". Turn right here and, when you reach China Farm on the left of the road, pass this farmhouse and turn left into the field. Cross diagonally right over the field, ignoring the farm track which follows the left hedge. Walk towards a small group of trees, you are now on your way to Larton. After you have crossed a two-bar stile, continue forward over a step-stile and a small stone footbridge until, after leaving the trees, you reach Larton Stables. The path now becomes a wide track following a straight line to reach Frankby Road. Carry on straight ahead through a bachelor gate, following a well-trodden pathway that rises as it passes close to Frankby Hall. This building was built in 1846 by Sir Thomas Royden. 80 years ago the Hall and it's 61 acre estate was offered to Hoylake Council for £8,000! As they weren't interested, Wallasey Corporation bought the estate for use as a cemetery and the Hall is now a chapel. The path passes the Hall, canying on straight ahead to end at the bachelor gate where it meets Montgomery Hill. Turn right, follow the road for about 100 yards and then turn left into a broad tree lined road that will take you back to the car park.

Act now or risk facing a fine, local tax specialist urges parents.

Parents across Wirral and Cheshire are being urged to act now rather than face fines over Child Benefit payments.

Under new rules introduced last year, around 1.1 million families containing one adult earning more than £50,000 during the 2012/13 tax year, must repay part of their child benefit, while those earning more than £60,000 need to repay it completely. The payments are declared by the high earner registering for Self Assessment and completing a tax return.

Gary Jacks who runs TaxAssist Accountants in Chester, Ellesmere Port, Moreton and Queensferry said: "For many families this will be the first time they have ever had to file tax returns and it is vital they don't get caught out.

"They only have until 31st January to file their tax return electronically and it could take up to 10 days just to register for online access if this is their first time filing. Anyone missing the 31st January deadline will be hit with an automatic £100 fine, with further penalties reaching £1,600 for those who file more than a year late.

"The only other option is to opt out of receiving Child Benefit in which case you're not liable for the new tax Charge and won't need to file a tax return for this. However you must ensure your affairs are in order, otherwise you may risk losing your entitlement to state benefits later in life."

It is speculated that 461,000 families have already opted out of receiving Child Benefit but about 120,000 parents are still yet to take any action and risk being fined.

Port Sunlight – The Royal Visit 1914

Both locally and nationally thoughts are turning to the summer and the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the First World War. Port Sunlight played a hugely important part in the conflict, the story of which will be told in forthcoming issues, but before then we thought we would look at life in the village in the run up to the War, and another memorable event that set the seal on the first 25 years of the villages history.

On the 25th March 1914, King George V & Queen Mary visited Port Sunlight to lay the foundation stone of the Lady Lever Art Gallery and see for themselves the famous works and village. Just days before the visit (and possibly in preparation for it), the last of the miniature gauge railway engines finished work on filling in the tidal creeks that had been a feature of the area for many years, and the village landscape was completed as we see it today.

The King was in the area to attend the Grand National at Aintree Racecourse, and was being hosted by the Earl of Derby of Knowsley Hall. The idea for the visit was first suggested when Sir William Lever and Lady Lever dined with the King & Queen at Knowsley in July 1913 on the night that Lever's Rivington Bungalow was raised to the ground by a militant suffragette, two weeks before Lady Lever's death.

It became fitting that the King consented to lay the foundation stone of the building that was to be Lady Lever's Memorial (at this point still called 'The Hulme Art Gallery'). The Royal party were visiting both Cheshire and Lancashire, and arrived by train at Port Sunlight from Chester via Hooton. As Port Sunlight only had a workers holt prior to 1914, a new platform and canopy were erected for the occasion.

After touring the works, the Royal party made their way to Hulme Hall where the King laid the foundation stone of the new Gallery via a small remote control model while the real one simultaneously came to rest half a mile away! After an impromptu visit to a workman's cottage on Bolton Road, the King and Queen toured the village before leaving for Birkenhead and Wallasey, where the King also laid the foundation stone of Wallasey Town Hall.



Left: 1834. Eastham windmill was originally sited in Carlett Park but in 1834 it was taken down and moved to the Chester side of Eastham Village. One of the sails was blown off during a gale in the last century so the miller removed the opposite sail. This worked well until a storm in 1895 blew the remaining two sails down, and the miller used them to repair his other mill at Willaston. This photograph shows how the mill lokked without any sails at the turn of the century. This mill was demolished in the 1930s. In 1932 a transport cafe was built on the site adjoining the mill by Cartwright Bros. This was later to become The Little Chef in the 1970s. Tóday it is better known as Starbucks on A41.





Above and far right: C1905. Looking down Ferry Road, **Eastham** with Lock Road on the right where the shed advertises a "covered bicycle stand". The pony and trap probably belonged to the photographer, F. Walker of Little Sutton, whose wife was sitting in the trap. The tea rooms, pictured above in Ferry Road, are here called Greenwoods, ready for any visitors to the Ferry from **Liverpool** and **Seacombe**.

Right: The sign above the door reads 'RV 1733' and probably refers to Richard Vernon. In 1822 records show that it was named The White Horse' but by 1850 it had changed to 'The Nag's Head' in Willaston. In the 1930s the building was structurally altered. See below photograph. Wm. Delamere was the victualler as well as the shopkeeper. George Barnes was the licensee in this 1910 photograph.





Left: Taken in the early 1930s. The Nag's Head has undergone major alterations from the inn pictured above. The house plate was repositioned to the centre, all the front windows have been altered and the brickwork pebbledashed. The building to the right which was once owned by the bailiff had been demolished, the road widened and Cannell Court Flats built on the site.

Right: Looking along Chester Road, Little Sutton where there is now a set of traffic lights, turning right into Ledsham Road. Walkers Lane is on the left of the photo by the light coloured car. This was named after the local chemist and photographer whose shop was situated at the corner C1932.





Below: The original village Inn stood opposite the Hooton Arms in Eastham. Pictured here in 1906 the Hooton Arms was once the school masters house and the school was the adjacent old barn with thatched roof and mud floor.

The cost to transform the room is £25,000 - having received £15,000 so far, a donation of £10,000 would make this project a reality.




