

# Autoreview by Tony Yates

Keeping you motoring

Volvo XC60 D4 AWD Momentum (Manual)



I am not sure how many of you have ever driven a Volvo – but let me tell you this; once you have, you will never drive anything else that feels even remotely close. So, why does a Volvo make you feel this way? Well, to be honest, I have no idea – all I can tell you is that every time I go out for a drive in a Volvo, I seem to be a better driver, and if I'm being honest, more courteous, more relaxed, and dare I say it – more like a human being and not a robot when out on the open road.

This, of course, gives me the starting block on how the XC60 faired when I took 'her' out for a spin to Norfolk.
I don't know much about Norfolk, apart from it has lovely beaches and some lovely roads. If I was you, I would go for a day out – but remember you will need a Volvo if you really want to experience the real driving pleasure of the XC60.

#### **Power and Efficiency:**

The XC60 I had on test was fitted with a 190hp four-cylinder 1,969cc diesel engine with 400Nm of torque at 1750rpm. 0-60 is dealt with in around 8.3sec (manual) and will max out at 127mph. I like this engine a lot because it's very refined and does the job of getting you around at a decent pace brilliantly. The big plus point here though is its torque levels which makes overtaking easy and pretty much effortless, even for a vehicle that I would consider to be large in size. For those of you looking for the fuel figures, I managed around 50+ mpg on the combined cycle.

#### On the road:

I expected nothing but the best because my test car was fitted with AWD - which basically means you can take it anywhere you like subject to the ride height of course. Remember this is not a Range Rover - but for me, it ticks all the right boxes and its AWD abilities are very good on pretty much any surface. I was actually amazed at the amount of grip it had on and off-road. Volvo have done a great job in getting this system to

work on all surfaces - while still allowing it to feel like a normal road car once you hit the tarmac, which is pretty hard to pull off - as most will suffer from either being a little soft or at the other end of the scale 'rock hard'. But Volvo seems to have found some middle ground here, which is, of course, a real blessing.

#### **Design & Technology:**

Volvo's interiors are very similar across all their models now - and are all very 'plush'. Also, everything fits and works well with the driver and nothing is fussy, even the touchscreen display is simple to use and not complex like the one BMW use. The seating is also well designed and even after a 4hr drive to the Norfolk coast, I still felt as fresh as a daisy.

Some of the standard equipment in the XC60 includes; City Safety with Steer Assist - which includes pedestrian, cyclist and large animal protection and front collision warning. Oncoming lane mitigation

- automatically provides steering assistance if you unwittingly drift out of your lane. Sensus Connect

- allows you access to a range of web apps and a

Bluetooth® Handsfree System and a 9" centre console touch screen, two-zone climate control, 8" active TFT crystal driver's information display, heated front seats, 18" alloy wheels, plus a whole host of additional features that will keep you going for weeks to come. But, let's be clear here, a lot of the features in the XC60 point to safety, which means the XC60 is doing all it can to keep you safe & sound.

#### To sum up:

A great machine that will do it's best to please you every time you turn the key - also, there are no surprises with the XC60 because you have it all wrapped up in one perfect package. So, all that's left to say is a perfect 5 stars from me.

### WALK AROUND WIRRAY

Glegg Arms Hotel - Gayton



Brimstage - Manor Wood - Gayton - Whitfiled Common - Barnston - Thingwall - Storeton -Brimstage. Leave your car in Brimstage at Green Bank, near the old village hall - now a children's nursery.

Walking distance (7.5 miles).

A varied walk taking in woodland, many attractive fieldpaths and a common. In the 1900's, Brimstage was known to thirsty walkers from Tranmere as "the three mile limit".

Crossing the fields from Tranmere entitled you to be called "a traveller". At the Red Cat Inn you could demand reasonable refreshment in "closed" hours! The pub was demolished in 1932 to make way for the new village hall - now a children's nursery.

Starting the walk, you need to cross the green and enter a short byway to the right of Brimstage Hall. Climb the steps in the wall - on the right. Enter into a field and continue to the far side. When you reach the road, follow ahead for a couple of minutes and then turn left into Talbot Avenue. Atthe distant end of this road you meet Manor Road. Go straight across to the signpost and through an opening you will join a grassy path. At first, the path will start and then bears left to pass under an ornamental bridge with hoardings on both sides. Soon, however, you will pass under a second bridge reaching open country. Here, the clear cut path leads you along the side of Manor Wood till you reach a one step stile leading into the trees. This path winds its way between the trees for 1/2 mile crossing two further stiles before running into a large field. Here you need to bear left and follow the path along the edge of the field, keeping the railway on your right, to reach a stile and the Chester High Road. Now turn Right and and after fifteen minutes walk you should be in Gayton bringing you to the Glegg Arms

This sturdy, half timbered building preserves the name of the famous Glegg family of Gayton Hall. The Glegg Arms has recently been very nicely revamped and provides a good range of drinks and food.

From the Glegg Arms cross the roundabout to the Devon Doorway Restaurant, into Telegraph Road. Not far ahead, on the right, you will pass by the Gayton Windmill and then your way is to the right into Mill Lane. Follow this lane into Milner Road, here you need to turn right, walk about 50 yards and then cross the road to enter a narrow footpath. This leads you to Whitfield Common, an open area of common land covered with gorse bushes. Go straight ahead for a couple of minutes and then bear to the right, when the path ends at Whitfield Lane, bear left as you cross the road and go over a stile to enter a footpath which runs between tall hedges.

You soon pass a school and reach a stone step-stile and open country. Your objective, Barnston Church, can be seen clearly ahead. Follow the well trodden path as it runs across the fields for half a mile, sometimes following the hedge and, at other times, leading diagonally across the meadows.

It ends at stone steps in a corner of the churchyard. Cross these and go along a passageway at the side of the old village school to reach Barnston. Turn left and follow Barnston Road as it winds down through the dale and then climbs up to Cross Hill at Thingwall. Here you need to turn right, along Holmwood Drive which shortly bears to the left bringing you to a sandy track. Follow this path downhill through the trees to reach a large, white house, "East Woodfinlow". Pass the house and turn right into a stony path that brings you to a gate and step-stile through into a grassy lane. The lane, after turning right and then left goes forward to a gate and stile, here you enter the fields. Keeping the hedge on your left as you cross the first 2 fields and, in the 3rd field, cross diagonally right to drop down to a plank foot-bridge crossing Prenton Brook. Climb several steps and carry on forward until you reach a path running between hedges. Continue forward at the end of this path to cross the railway and a 5 step-stile. Beyond the railway, your way is still ahead to cross a stream and reach the bridge spanning the motorway. The path across the next field brings you to a stile and so into Storeton.

Here you turn to the right, along Landican Lane until, shortly after passing the old school, you arrive at a roundabout. Go across and turn left along the village street for a short distance and then turn right to pass Home Farm. Now look right for a broad farm-track way marked "To Brimstage".

This takes you past a farm and the leads up to a bachelor gate. Pass through and then go straight across towards the motorway and a stile admitting you to a path running parallel with the M53. This short path soon brings you to 2 further step-stiles and, once over these, you reach Brimstage Lane. Here you turn right and follow the lane under the motorway. Now go forward

along the winding lane for half a mile or so to arrive back at the starting point!

#### General tasks and garden maintenance.



#### Start your compost

Get your compost going by buying a compost bin or building a partially enclosed and easily accessible area for a heap. It is essential to replace the goodness in soil and autumn produces quantities of garden waste that will add invaluable organic richness back into your soil next spring.

Remember to add a variety of different materials; spent vegetable plants are ideal, but NEVER add diseased or pest-ridden material to your compost heap - it will nurture whatever villain you are trying to eliminate with loving care!

#### Clear garden debris

Keep weeding; most perennial weeds are susceptible to weedkiller this month and systemic weedkillers will carry on working throughout the winter. Also clear any debris and diseased material from your garden. Pests and diseases that overwinter in your garden will reappear next spring with a vengeance so get rid of them now. Burn diseased material and put the rest of your garden rubbish (apart from woody stems) in the compost.


#### Clean out the greenhouse

Once tomatoes and other greenhouse crops are over, give the greenhouse a thorough clean to prevent pests from making a home in that lovely warm environment, ready to leap into action next spring.

#### Dig clay soil

If your soil is heavy clay, start digging it over now - add plenty of organic matter to improve the quality and pea shingle to improve the drainage. It can be left in a pretty rough state over the winter when the cold will break the lumps down, making spring planting infinitely easier!

#### Watering



For recently planted large shrubs or trees, leave a hose trickling around the base for an hour. The same goes for established plants in dry periods - camellias, rhododendrons, azaleas and hydrangeas will abort next season's flowers if they get too dry.



Ensure trees or shrubs planted in the last couple of years on lawns or in areas of rough grass have a circle of clear earth around them - this MUST be kept clear or grass will prevent essential moisture getting through. Mulching with bark or compost will help.

#### Planting

With the ideal planting conditions of autumn (warm moist soil), now is the time to plant container grown shrubs, trees, fruit bushes, perennials and bulbs. The key to successful planting is to water in well. Soak the rootball in a bucket until no air bubbles come to the surface, dig the planting hole, fill with water and allow to drain away. Place the plant in the hole, fill with soil, firm gently and water well with a watering can - this will give the plant a huge advantage over one planted with a dry rootball in a dry hole and watered only on the surface.


Left: 1896. The horse and cart has just crossed the bridge over Wallasey Pool, connecting Birkenhead and Wallasey.
Originally known as the 'Half-penny Bridge' due to the cost of the toll from when it opened in 1843, it became known as the Penny Bridge when the toll was increased in 1896. A new swing bridge replaced the old one.

Left: 1899. This Merryweather Steamer, which would be hauled by either two or four horses, was purchased for the **Wallasey** Fire Brigade. Sperintendent John Howarth is seen on the right.

Below: 1902. The beach at New Brighton was a popular place to be seen, wearing hat and dark clothes.





Left 1901. The boys are using the entrance to the Liscard Battery entrance as a goal. The battery was built in 1858 but never fired a shot in anger. The magazines were located nearby from the late 1700s when visiting ships to the Mersey would have to deposit any gunpowder while in port. Much to the relief of the local residents, from 1851 gunpowder was transfered to magazine ships moored off New Ferry. Note the barrel of a discarded canon on the right.

Below 1901. A view of Central Park **Liscard** with people enjoying the views and other more strenuous ones rowing on the lake.



Above 1902. Work on building New Brighton Tower commenced June 1896 with the grounds being opened at Whitsun 1897 and the tower in 1900. As New Brighton was competing with Blackpool for the Lancashire and Midlands town holiday trade, at 621 feet high their tower was over 50feet higher than Blackpool's.





Above: C.1895. A line of horse-drawn cabs await custom at **Seacombe** Ferry. All of this part of the approach road was built on reclaimed land, being opened in 1880. Following the opening, a 24 hour ferry service was started between Seacombe and Liverpool with hourly sailings throughout the night at a fare of 6d (2½ p)



Left 1896. **New Brighton** Lighthouse can be seen to the right of the bathing machines on wheels. These machines were required by the local by-laws to be used when bathing. Fines were imposed if not used. There were separate bathing huts for men and women - horses would take them into the water.





# **GET FOILED**

# Learn why foil-packet cooking is hot, hot, hot

s the saying goes, big things come in small packages and that may explain the burgeoning popularity of foil-packet recipes.

Minimal preparation and cleanup are easy trade-offs for the immense flavours you can create in these tiny containers, whether you prepare them in the oven, on the grill or over an open flame.

Servings: 4
Prep time: 10 minutes
Cook time: 45 minutes

- 4 tablespoons Seasoned Rice Vinegar
- Roasted Garlic
- 2 teaspoons gochujang (chile bean paste)
- 6 tablespoons maple syrup
- 4 teaspoons soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons, plus 2 teaspoons, olive oil
- 4 teaspoons Dijon mustard
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon pepper
- 8 chicken thighs
- 4 cups fresh cauliflower, riced (use grater or food processer so cauliflower resembles rice)
- 1 1/2 cups fresh scallions, sliced
- 2 cups fresh sugar snap peas
- 3 sprigs fresh cilantro, for garnish

Heat oven or grill to 375 F.

In large bowl, mix together vinegar, gochujang, maple syrup, soy sauce, olive oil, mustard, salt and pepper to form marinade. Dip chicken in marinade and toss lightly until coated.

Lightly oil foil pouch and layer base of pouch with cauliflower. Add scallions and sugar snap peas then place chicken on top. Carefully pour remaining marinade over pouch contents (ensuring that liquid stays inside foil).

Seal foil packet and bake or grill 30 minutes. Open foil to create 2-inch long vent then bake or grill another 15 minutes, or until completely cooked. Garnish with cilantro before serving.

**Chef's tip:** For best results and added flavour, marinate chicken 30 minutes before preparing pouches.

**Substitutions:** In place of gochujang, red pepper flake paste can be made by mixing 1 tablespoon red pepper flakes with a few dashes soy sauce and 1 dash sugar. Alternatively, substitute 2 teaspoons sriracha for gochujang.



#### Friends of Hadlow Station Update (July 2018)

All three trolleys are now fully refurbished and safely secured to the platform and the fixing of the milk churns to the main trolley will be undertaken over the coming weeks.

The AV system in the waiting is now showing short films of volunteer work done as well as showing events held at the station and will be on to view from 10.00 am to 4.00 pm every day controlled by a timer switch.

The old rotten sleepers have been totally removed and safely disposed of, and the stone chippings has also been lifted and stored so that the railway line is at the correct height relative to the platform. The railway "chairs" that support the railway track on the sleepers have also been taken up and securely stored.

The new grade A recycled hardwood sleepers will be re-laid over the coming weeks by a Network Rail Training company following which the railway track will be put down and finally railway ballast will be laid. Whilst the new sleepers have been delivered we have identified that some of them are not up to standard. However work will start in laying the ones that are of good quality whilst the sub-standard ones will be replaced when additional sleepers are delivered.

The Hadlow Station sign has been fully restored with new wood, with drainage holes in the base to prevent the wood rotting again, and repainted.

The last of the sash windows in the kitchen has been replaced so that all windows in the kitchen now open. Many thanks to Tim Coombes from Wirral Sash windows for this support. Having all windows opening is a great help to the volunteers cooking during this very hot weather.

The gardens are looking good, and the new perimeter trees are growing well although needing lots of regular watering at the moment by other volunteers.

New benches and plaques have been fitted on the far (South) platform, and a villager stopped the other day to comment how lovely it was to sit in the warm evenings down at the station, which now looks so nice, and she said that every bench was occupied at 8pm! We are delighted to have such positive community feedback and what a lovely way to enjoy the beautiful summer evenings we have been experiencing.

The pop-up cafe is so busy we have purchased more chairs and 2 further tables although additional table cloths will now need to be purchased and as a result, the kitchen now has no further space for storing any additional furniture as it has to be packed away after each pop-up café session.

2 long service award BR pocket watches and other train related memorabilia have been donated to FHRS for display in the Ticket Office. However, these will be valued and insured before being put out on display.



# Have you ever been involved in a Christmas Shoebox appeal?

Last year Teams4U distributed 38,000 gift-filled shoeboxes to Belarus, Bosnia, the Ukraine and Romania. The Teams4U charity also works throughout the year with the local people in these countries to help improve the quality of their lives. From 2018 Teams4U will be operating on the Wirral with their own warehouse collecting shoeboxes for children.

Dave Cooke, the founder of the original Christmas Shoebox Charity has never been a stranger to risks or the dedication it takes to start up a charity! In 1990, after seeing the images break of the orphans from Ceausescu's regime in Romania, he decided, with the help of some friends, to get an aid wagon together and drive it across Europe, hoping the medical supplies, beds, blankets and clothes would radically change the horrific conditions in which these children were living. What he didn't know (and no-one knew) was that the few thousand shoebox gifts that went across with the convoy from Wrexham would grow into the biggest shoebox programme in the world!

In 1994 Operation Christmas Child was amalgamated with the American-led International Charity Samaritan's Purse. Dave resigned from his job as Contracts Manager for a Window Installation company and became SP's Overseas Projects Manager, delivering shoeboxes all across the world whilst developing their Soccer programme and Second Chance programme; taking sports and games to street-children and juvenile convicts.

From those years pioneering new programmes and visiting new countries grew the seeds for Teams4U. Seeing children without family or community, traumatised through abuse, war and poverty, laugh and play again through the sports programmes empowered Dave to make that the focus of T4U. Dave founded Teams4U in 2006 after experiencing the atrocities of the Beslan crisis in 2004 when over 300 people were killed in a school attack in Russia. From his experience working as an International Projects Manager for SP, he was invited to take a team of volunteers into Beslan to be part of the rehabilitation process there. Out of that harrowing situation, Dave realised the difference short-term teams can make and wanted to set up an organisation that

could give anyone the opportunity of travelling abroad to assist children in crisis

"I want to give people who aren't able to give up their day-to-day lives the opportunity to go overseas and make a difference. Most of us have jobs, families, mortgages and bills to pay. We can't all spend months or years abroad. But I don't want that to stop people from travelling to the third world, getting off the tourist route, and meeting the needs of the children there. From whatever walk or stage of life you're in, I want to give you the opportunity to travel with Teams4U " Dave Cooke

Meanwhile, if you don't fancy volunteering abroad the Charity has returned to the simple model of giving a shoebox for a boy, a girl or a family box at Christmastime. 


