

Each month Phoenix Legal Solicitors will answer your legal problems.

This months topic – Business Interruption

As a business you may have a term in your business insurance to cover losses if your business cannot open such as during the recent lockdown. Business interruption is there to protect the business against financial loss suffered during an incident such as fire, flood or other incidents such as a lockdown where the business has been forced to close.

Business are finding that some insurers are refusing claims under the business interruption terms but that does not mean that you were not covered.

There are two types of policy that your business may be covered for:

- 1. Infectious Disease Many policies expressly state which diseases fall into this category and so as Covid-19 was a new disease it will not have been listed in these policies and so you may be able to claims. Many policies require the disease to be on your premises but some specify a radius around your premises
- 2. Denial of Access This is cover if you are prevented access to your property by an event, or actions from a competent authority. In these clauses there are often differences in the wording so you may be covered, but it will depend on your circumstances and the policy wording.

We will require copies of your insurance and the terms and conditions, at the time the policy was taken out. Some insurers are changing the terms and conditions but it is what they were at the time of interruption that matters.

We will also need you profit and loss accounts from the previous years so that we can calculate the loss to your business and quantify the claim.

Once we have the above we will contact your insurers on your behalf to make a claim.

If you haven't made a claim or have been rejected by your insurers then get in touch now as you could be missing out on thousands of pounds that you are entitled to.

As well as reopening the popular farm shop, the café is back open for breakfasts and light lunches and a Holiday Club is running summer activities for children.

The Holiday Club, which has places still available, has a range of different outdoor activities including teaching children how to grow, harvest and cook their own vegetables.

The club also includes cooking sessions, a gardening club, arts and crafts, family picnic days, a nature trail and games.

Children taking part in the club, which runs until the end of August, also receive educational information about healthy cooking and living.

Review by Tony

Keeping you motoring

Skoda CITIGOe iV SE L



This week I have been testing the Skoda CITIGOe and I'm happy to report right from the start it's a proper little mover. I have a natural dislike of vehicles with electric engines because petrol runs through my veins like blood - but I have to embrace the future, so why not start with something small and perfectly formed. Also, I have a VW UP! a car I love very much - so the CITIGOe was in my book just like driving my car - but much faster off the line truth be told.

Well, let's see how it fared in this weeks review.

Power and Efficiency:

The CITIGOe is fitted with an electric motor that has 61kW (83PS) of instant power. Until you drive an electric vehicle you just can't comprehend just how quickly it moves you about. Also, I'm sure you all want to know how far it will go on a single charge. Well, I managed 170miles which in my book is pretty good. Top speed will also stop at around 81mph and 0-62 will come in at around 12.3 seconds.

My test car was fitted with an array of fuel-saving features which helps you get more miles for your charge. Let's be honest here - it's blistering fast for such a small car, and it's a blast at the traffic lights. It is also very very refined thanks to

its 'silent running'. Even the eco tyres were less noisy than I imagined them to be.

On the road:

The CITIGOe does not feel heavy or cumbersome at all - and you can sense that Skoda has put a lot of effort into setting up the suspension and chassis. The CITIGOe will also keep you and your passengers firmly in their seats thanks to a softer suspension setup that won't have you bouncing all over the place like a rubber ball. That's because smaller cars tend to bounce you all of the place, but the little CITIGOe was a real peach. I also liked how it cornered, and how it just glided across all the lumps and bumps in the road ahead, even when the road is full of potholes (like my road)

Interior & Technology:

The interior is of a good standard and its controls are well set out and all the dials are clear to read. The space inside is also good, better than most – but it's very basic. Don't get me wrong – basic is good. You can also easily fit four adults

comfortably on the inside. Plus – everything inside the CITIGOe feels very well put together thanks to the usual Skoda quality.

You also get lots of kit such as; 16" Scorpius black alloy wheels, ambient lighting, ESC, front & rear fog lights, electric front windows, head and side airbags for the front seat, lane assist, LED daytime running lights, radio Swing with DAB & six speakers, rain & light sensor, remote control locking with SAFE function & tyre pressure monitoring system. This is just a small amount of what you will find. The interior is also funky and the seats even as basic as they look are really comfy.

To sum up:

A great buy for your first electric small car – If you are searching for one of the best small electric vehicles on the road at the moment – then the Skoda CITIGOe is a real contender.

Five of the best UK day trips

From the romantic Lindisfarne castle to the spectacular views from the Lizard Peninsular, from RSPB nature reserves to family-run farms open to visitors, day trips are a great way to explore the UK.

With many Brits choosing to save money by spending holiday time at home instead of venturing overseas, the summer day trip is a school holiday saviour. With plenty of cost-effective days out accessible by car but not always by public transport, new drivers have a wealth of day trip opportunities to explore across the UK.

We turned to the experts at **RED Driving School** for five of the best summer day trips, perfect for new drivers.



Lindisfarne castle, Northumberland

- * Lindisfarne castle, Northumberland Located on the remote Holy Island off the coast of Northumberland, Lindisfarne Castle is only accessible via a three-mile causeway at low tide. Lindisfarne is a romantic 16th century castle, although the site was originally a Tudor fort, which is a mile walk from the car park along a tarmac road and cobbled path. Admission to the castle is £6.95 for adults and £3.50 for children. Visitors should check tide times in advance to get the most out of this historic day trip.
- * Clumber Park, Nottinghamshire For an active day out with spectacular views, pack your bike in your car and drive to Clumber Park in Nottinghamshire. With 3,800 acres of gardens, parkland and woodland to explore and 20 miles of picturesque cycle routes, visitors can easily spend a whole day enjoying the great outdoors. Parking is just £5 for the day and entry to Clumber Park is free, with a cafe and cycle hire plus toilet facilities.
- * Arne Nature Reserve, Dorset This RSPB-managed reserve is home to almost 500 types of flowering plant and is known for its lowland heathland and oak woodland. Wildlife includes British reptiles, Dartford warblers, nightjars and many species of moth, dragonfly and butterfly. The reserve overlooks Poole Harbour where visitors can watch birdlife including wading birds, ducks and geese, black tailed godwits, brent geese and avocets. Parking is £4 for the day and is free for RSPB members.
- * The Lizard Peninsula and Kynance Cove For beautiful views and a taste of British history, visit the the most southerly point. The secluded Kynance Cove is just two miles north of Lizard Village, visit at low tide when a sandy beach is revealed. As well as the picturesque views, visitors can enjoy walks along the coastline. Local facilities include parking, food vendors and public toilets.
- * The Seven Sisters Sheep Centre, Sussex Situated in the South Downs national park and housed in a 17th century barn, this family-run farm specialises in sheep breeding, with over 40 different breeds, as well as goats, rabbits and chicks . A child-friendly day out, visitors can feed the animals, see lambs and sheep being shorn and milked, watch wool being spun and learn about cheese-making. Parking is available on site and the farm is wheelchair accessible, with toilets and a picnic area, Admission is budget friendly, at just £5 for adults and £4 for children. Located just one mile from Beachy Head, finish your afternoon with a cliff-top walk enjoying scenic views out to sea. Dominic Cohen of RED Driving School says: "Learning to drive makes spontaneous day trips more accessible, so new drivers can easily take advantage of unexpected sunshine and explore local countryside, coastline, history and wildlife, especially areas which are less accessible by public transport. "Learner drivers should encounter a range of different motoring experiences in their driving lessons, so should pass their test prepared to drive on rural roads. The independent driving aspect of driving lessons should help to prepare new drivers with navigation skills. Planning summer day trips with friends is the perfect way for new drivers to continue to develop their route planning and navigation skills."











Top Five Facts: Paralympics

Wartime

The first Paralympic Games was held in 1948 at the same time as the Summer Olympics in London, UK. Initially, only a small band of British World War II veterans took part.

Diamond

The current 400m world track record is held by South African 'Blade Runner' Oscar Pistorius, who clocked a rapid 47.04 seconds earlier this year – beating his earlier 2008 gold medal winning time of 47.49. He runs using the Flex-Foot Cheetah blades in the image above.

Wonderland

The first Winter Paralympic Games were held in Sweden in 1976. They were the first Games to feature athletes other than those wheelchair-bound. Now the games allow competitors with a broad array of disabilities to take part.

Scandal

The Paralympic Games has been subjected to numerous cheating scandals since it was launched. Competitors have been found guilty of steroid use, autonomic dysreflexia and actually being able-bodied.

Champion

Paralympian Trischa Zorn is the most decorated competitor in the history of the Games. From 1980 to 2004 she won a total of 55 medals, 41 of which are gold, in blind swimming events.

FREE PARKING FOR FERRY COMMUTERS



Commuters will continue to be able to park for free when travelling by ferry between Seacombe and Liverpool under plans to bring the world famous Eureka Museum to Wirral.

Eureka! Mersey is due to open in 2022 in the iconic terminal building which previously housed Spaceport.

Changes to the car park, which will come into effect once the attraction is opened, will mean visitors to the museum will have to pay for parking. After this date those with weekly, monthly and yearly travel tickets - who use Seacombe to travel to Liverpool - will still benefit from free parking once the visitor attraction opens. Until Eureka! Mersey opens there will be no charge to use the car park.

Commuters will still be able to cycle to the Seacombe and take their bicycle across to Liverpool to continue their ride. As part of a major new cycle route from Birkenhead to New Brighton, due to be completed by 2023, a connection will also be made to Seacombe Ferry Terminal via St Paul's Road to help people to cycle to Eureka.

Merseytravel currently leases two areas of land from Wirral Council adjacent to the Seacombe Ferry Terminal which are aimed at helping the movement of commuters by providing car parking for the ferry, and this will continue when the museum opens. The system for allocating these spaces is still being determined.

However, Eureka will need to charge its visitors for parking to ensure it can meet its business plan and operate sustainably.

The museum is intended to be a world-class visitor attraction for 6 to 14-year-olds, with an additional area dedicated to the 0-5 years age group. As well as contributing to the local economy and creating dozens of jobs, Eureka! Mersey will be focused on children and families.

The team at Eureka! has used a unique "cocreation" process, bringing local young people together with industry and expert partners to agree the stories and activities that will feature in Eureka! Mersey.

Many young people from the region have been involved in designing exhibition content, working in partnership with key Liverpool City Region businesses including Ørsted, Unilever, Sci-tech Daresbury and Arup as well as Liverpool John Moores University.

The museum is being developed by Eureka! in partnership with Merseytravel, the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority and Wirral Council.

Wirral Council leader, Cllr Pat Hackett, said: "Eureka! Mersey is moving closer to arriving here in Wirral where it will be a world class attraction and play an important part in the continuing development of Wirral's occ

"I have no doubt that Eureka! Mersey will not only attract many thousands of new visitors to the area but it will play a crucial role in inspiring future generations to take an interest in those science and technical subjects.

"So many people have worked incredibly hard to get us to this point and I want to thank them for their continuing work to bring such an innovative attraction to the region."

Eureka! Chief Executive Leigh-Anne Stradeski said "We are thrilled to be on track for opening Eureka! Mersey in two year's time. We have been working closely with the children and young people from the local Wirral community and broader City Region to ensure that we include the content and experiences that are relevant to them and reflect current issues and future challenges."

"We have a real focus on environmental issues and we will encourage our visitors to use sustainable transport wherever possible. Our location at Seacombe Terminal will support this and we are working with our key partners to achieve improved public transport and cycling facilities."





As New Brighton was competing with Blackpool for the Lancashire and Midlands town holiday trade, at 621 feet high their tower was over 50feet higher than Blackpool's.





Above: C.1895. A line of horse-drawn cabs await custom at **Seacombe** Ferry. All of this part of the approach road was built on reclaimed land, being opened in 1880. Following the opening, a 24 hour ferry service was started between Seacombe and Liverpool with hourly sailings throughout the night at a fare of 6d (2½ p)



Left 1896. **New Brighton** Lighthouse can be seen to the right of the bathing machines on wheels. These machines were required by the local by-laws to be used when bathing. Fines were imposed if not used. There were separate bathing huts for men and women - horses would take them into the water.

Cheshire West Council leader opens Covid-19 proof family rooms

A Puddington care home has created two Covid-19 proof family rooms to allow families to safely visit their relatives.

Chapel House Care, a family business established in 1987, operates The Chapel House and Plessington Court care homes in the village. The homes offer residential, nursing and dementia care in a safe, secure and friendly environment.

Inside each home they have built a dedicated visiting pod to allow family and relatives to safely see each other. Councillor Louise Gittins, Leader of Cheshire West and Chester Council, officially opened both rooms on July 10th 2020.

"Each room has a glass panel and an intercom system so visitors can see and hear each other in a safe and enclosed environment. We're encouraging families to bring in photo albums and favourite music so they can share memories with their relative.

"It's going to be emotional for family to see their loved ones for the first time in

so many months but we are proud to have created a safe environment for them to be able to do so."

Relatives are given regular weekly time slots to safely visit and already a grandson about to get married has arranged to visit his grandmother ahead of his big day and a son is driving up from London to see his mother for the first time since Lockdown.

Councillor Gittins said: "The new family rooms at The Chapel House and Plessington Court are brilliant. They're a lovely and innovative way of ensuring that people can come and see their loved ones after such a long time.

"It's heart-breaking to be kept apart from family but we need to keep following Public Health guidelines and trusting in the professionalism of the care home managers.

Hamilton Overcomes Late Puncture to Win 7th British Grand Prix

SILVERSTONE, England—August 2nd—Two safety car periods and a flat left front tire car laps from the end didn't stop Lewis Hamilton on Sunday. The favorite son won his seventh British Grand Prix by holding off Max Verstappen by five seconds. Ferrari's Charles Leclerc finished third.

Lewis Hamilton: Until the last lap, everything was relatively smooth sailing. Then I noticed the shape of the tire shifting, and that was heart in the mouth. I didn't know if it had gone down until I braked. Then just driving it, sometimes it will come off and break the wing. I nearly didn't get around the last two corners.

For most of the race, Hamilton had no trouble taking the lead from Mercedes teammate, Valtteri Bottas, and kept it as high as 2.1 seconds. Others were making more of a train–from fourth to tenth–even following two safety car periods. Those occurred when Red Bull's Alex Albon struck Haas F1 driver Kevin Magnussen at Stowe, spinning the Dane into the wall and retiring him from the race. On lap 12, Dani Kvyat crashed into Maggots when his front right tire deflated going into the corner. Although Kvyat was unhurt, he severely damaged his Alpha Tauri's rear wing and back section.

The rest of the race seemed uneventful until Bottas suffered a right-front tire failure with a few laps to

go. Bottas crawled into the pits, losing second to Verstappen.

At that point, Verstappen felt satisfied with second place and decided to pit for fresh tires in an effort to get the single point for fastest lap. Ironically, he would have won the race had he stayed on old tires. That's because of Hamilton's tire failure, which caused the Briton to hold on slowly to win by just a few seconds.

Hamilton might have dodged a bullet, but he knew there was trouble when it happened. "The car seemed to turn OK through Maggotts and Becketts, and then it was a real struggle in the last two corners. I could hear the gap coming down from 19 to 10. I could hear out of the last corner him going, 'Nine, eight, seven,' and I was just like, 'Get back on the gas!"

In a wild finish for the rest of the top ten, Daniel Ricciardo took advantage of the bad luck from Bottas and Sainz Jr. to take fourth for Renault. Teammate Esteban Ocon finished in sixth. Lando Norris took fifth in the only McLaren left in the race, while Pierre Gasly, Albon, Lance Stroll, and Sebastian Vettel finished seventh through tenth, respectively.

In the second American Haas F1 car, Romain Grosjean, who had been as high as fifth after staying out following the second safety car period, ended up 16th overall.

Mercedes Captures Another Pole, but This Time It's Bottas, Not Hamilton

SILVERSTONE, England—August 8th—Putting his foot down on the accelerator and forgetting about the puncture that put him out of the points last weekend, Valtteri Bottas made his last qualifying lap count Saturday afternoon. Bottas posted a 1:25:124 fastest lap to start at the front for Sunday's 70th Anniversary Grand Prix race at Silverstone, England.

Lewis Hamilton, who thought he had grabbed the 92nd pole of his career, ended up finishing second. Nico Hulkenberg, substituted for Sergio Perez, put his Racing Point entry third-his best qualifying


finish in years.

Max Verstappen had to use his last lap to take fourth, finishing just ahead of Renault's Daniel Ricciardo. Lance Stroll was sixth in the other Racing Point, while Pierre Gasly finished seventh in the Alpha Tauri. Ferrari's Charles Leclerc was eighth.

Red Bull's Alex Albon and McLaren's Lando Norris rounded out the top ten as ten other drivers failed on Saturday.

Both Alfa Romeo's of Antonio Giovinazzi and Kimi Raikkonen again failed to get out of the opening session, and Nicolas Latifi, Dani Kvyat, and the Haas F1 of Kevin Magnussen also failed to advance. The second session had more names depart, including Esteban Ocon, Sebastian Vettel, Carlos Sainz Jr., George Russell, and Romain Grosjean in the second American Hass F1 car.

Despite Saturday's success, Bottas knows that the more pressing matter is what happens on Sunday. "Of course, when you are starting from pole, you aim to win. The first job is to get off the line, and the mentality is to win. That's it."





General tasks and garden maintenance.



Start your compost

Get your compost going by buying a compost bin or building a partially enclosed and easily accessible area for a heap. It is essential to replace the goodness in soil and autumn produces quantities of garden waste that will add invaluable organic richness back into your soil next spring.

Remember to add a variety of different materials; spent vegetable plants are ideal, but NEVER add diseased or pest-ridden material to your compost heap - it will nurture whatever villain you are trying to eliminate with loving care!

Clear garden debris

Keep weeding; most perennial weeds are susceptible to weedkiller this month and systemic weedkillers will carry on working throughout the winter. Also clear any debris and diseased material from your garden. Pests and diseases that overwinter in your garden will reappear next spring with a vengeance so get rid of them now. Burn diseased material and put the rest of your garden rubbish (apart from woody stems) in the compost.

Clean out the greenhouse

Once tomatoes and other greenhouse crops are over, give the greenhouse a thorough clean to prevent pests from making a home in that lovely warm environment, ready to leap into action next spring.

Dig clay soil

If your soil is heavy clay, start digging it over now - add plenty of organic matter to improve the quality and pea shingle to improve the drainage. It can be left in a pretty

rough state over the winter when the cold will break the lumps down, making spring planting infinitely easier!

Watering

Should September turn into an Indian summer, remember to keep watering thoroughly once or twice a week rather than little and often. Containers and hanging baskets need watering every day.

For recently planted large shrubs or trees, leave a hose trickling around the base for an hour. The same goes for established plants in dry periods - camellias, rhododendrons, azaleas and hydrangeas will abort next season's flowers if they get too dry.



Ensure trees or shrubs planted in the last couple of years on lawns or in areas of rough grass have a circle of clear earth around them - this MUST be kept clear or grass will prevent essential moisture getting through. Mulching with bark or compost will help.

Planting

With the ideal planting conditions of autumn (warm moist soil), now is the time to plant container grown shrubs, trees, fruit bushes, perennials and bulbs. The key to successful planting is to water in well. Soak the rootball in a bucket until no air bubbles come to the surface, dig the planting hole, fill with water and allow to drain away. Place the plant in the hole, fill with soil, firm gently and water well with a watering can - this will give the plant a huge advantage over one planted with a dry rootball in a dry hole and watered only on the surface.



NEW CHARTER FOR OPEN SPACES



The Open Spaces Society(1), Britain's oldest national conservation body, calls for a better deal for open spaces. Today it launches its charter for open spaces [attached] and has written to Robert Jenrick, the Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, and to all of England's planning authorities.

The society calls on government to introduce a national plan and standards for open spaces, and to place a duty on local authorities to ensure that everyone can enjoy good-quality, well-maintained and safe open space within 300 metres of their homes. It says that such spaces should be secured as part of development. Local Green Space(2) must offer greater protection than now, and the process for designating it must be improved.

The society urges planning authorities to adopt robust policies for the acquisition, management and protection of green spaces, to have a budget for them and to dedicate their green spaces as town or village green to ensure their protection.

It recommends communities to get involved in their local planning processes before land is allocated for development, to identify spaces which need protection and to form friends' groups to champion local spaces.


The society pledges to lobby government to secure open spaces and access to nature through the 25-year environment plan, the Agriculture and Environment Bills and the new Environmental Land Management Scheme. It will continue to advise its members on how to protect their open spaces.

In particular the society wants to see greater use of the opportunity to register land as a town or village green(3) as mitigation for development, and has asked each planning authority to consider voluntary registration of the land which it owns, and to encourage developers to do the same by making this a condition of planning permission. It has also asked the authorities to send examples of its policies and good practice

for open spaces, so that the society can create a dossier for green space, and spread the word.

Says Phil Wadey, the society's newly-elected chairman: 'During lockdown people have enjoyed their local spaces and paths as never before, and this use continues beyond the pandemic. We know there is a great disparity in the distribution and quality of open spaces, and that investment in these assets provides excellent value for money by improving people's health and well-being.

'We therefore call on government, local authorities and communities to work together to ensure that everyone has access to good-quality green space close to home. This is a vital element of the green recovery after the pandemic. We have made proposals as to how this can be achieved.'
