

THIS DAY IN HISTORY FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL

4th April 1964

The Beatles hold so many records in music history, but one record is likely never to be touched.

On April 4, 1964, The Fab Four owned the Billboard charts, as they held the top five spots on the Billboard Hot 100.

After only two weeks on the charts, "Can't Buy Me Love" hit No. 1, while "Twist and Shout," "She Loves You," "I Want To Hold Your Hand" and "Please Please Me" round out the top five. In all, they had 12 spots on the charts that week.

14th April 1983



Do you remember seeing the first cordless telephones on the news? Can you believe they first went on sale in Britain in 1983, let alone almost everyone has one.

These phones made telephone calls only.

Today's telephones have come such a long way, who would have imagined we could hold not only a telephone, but an amazing quality camera together with a high powered computer with the ability to browse the internet, play games, read books and so much more in the palm of our hand!

17th April 1969

This was the day the age at which a person was eligible to vote in Britain was lowered from 21 to 18.

With the passing of the Representation of the People Act In 1969, the UK became the first democracy to lower the voting age from 21 to 18 for national, regional, and local elections. Beyond the UK at that time, the lowest voting age was 20, in Australia, Japan. Sweden and Switzerland. Most countries quickly followed the UK, to the extent that 18 became the standard international age of democratic enfranchisement.

22nd April 1969

In 1969 at a UNESCO Conference in San Francisco, peace activist John McConnell proposed a day to honor the Earth and the concept of peace, to first be observed on March 21, 1970, the first day of spring in the northern hemisphere. This day of nature's equipoise was later sanctioned in a proclamation written by McConnell and signed by Secretary General U Thant at the United Nations. A month later, United States Senator Gaylord Nelson proposed the idea to hold a nationwide environmental teach-in on April 22, 1970. He hired a young activist, Denis Hayes, to be the



National Coordinator. Nelson and Hayes renamed the event "Earth Day". Denis and his staff grew the event beyond the original idea for a teach-in to include the entire United States. More than 20 million people poured out on the streets, and the first Earth Day remains the largest single-day protest in human history.

The first Earth Day was focused on the United States. In 1990, Denis Hayes, the original national coordinator in 1970, took it international and organized events in 141 nations.

On Earth Day 2016, the landmark Paris Agreement was signed by the United States, the United Kingdom, China, and 120 other countries. This signing satisfied a key requirement for the entry into force of the historic draft climate protection treaty adopted by consensus of the 195 nations present at the 2015 United Nations Climate Change Conference in Paris.

On Earth Day 2020, over 100 million people around the world observed the 50th anniversary in what is being referred to as the largest online mass mobilization in history.

Suddenly, a dark shadow passed directly in front of her and she felt as though she'd ridden through an ice cold shower. Pulling hard on her rear brake she lost control and skidded off the path. The front wheel hit a large stone and she was sent hurdling over the handlebars, crashing heavily into one of the old oak trees that lined the country lane.



Watch Your Step in Merseyside to help the RSPB protect ground nesting birds this spring

People have been noticing nature much more during lockdowns, as garden birds and other wildlife have helped lift spirits and connect us to the world outside. A recent survey commissioned by the RSPB showed that 41% of participants reported seeing wildlife near their homes that they had never noticed before between 2020 and 2021.

Almost half of the UK population have said they have tried to attract nature to their gardens but the RSPB is keen to highlight that many of our threatened species don't use gardens and nest boxes when raising young.

Over half of England's most threatened breeding species nest on or near to the ground, including curlew, little tern, nightjar and lapwing.







"If you ask a child where bird's nest, they are likely say a tree, hedge or nest box. It's an image we've all grown up with but for some of our most threatened species it's simply not true. Almost every natural habitat in the English countryside can be home to ground nesting birds and these threatened species are under increasing pressure due habitat loss, predators and climate change. Yet we can all help protect them from disturbance by simply following the Countryside Code and keeping to footpaths." Sara Humphrey, Communications Manager

Around Merseyside, coastal areas, including saltmarshes and beaches are often home to ground nesting birds too. Little tern and ringed plover often nest near the tide's edge on shingle beaches and birds like oystercatcher and redshank create small nests hidden in the short undergrowth on marshes. As vulnerable chicks are easy prey for predators, dogs running through nesting sites can be very stressful for breeding birds. By sticking to paths, watching out for signage or alarm calls and keeping dogs on leads in these habitats, you can help give chicks the best chance of survival.

Uplands and moors are also vital homes to ground nesting birds including curlew, dunlin and golden plover. The hen harrier, one of the UK's most threatened birds of prey, also nests at ground level in some upland areas.

As birds nesting on the ground are at higher risk from predators; the nests and eggs they contain are often extremely well camouflaged, making them very hard to see and avoid.

"A skylark egg can be as small as 17mm, that's around the width of a 5p piece. And when those eggs hatch, chicks can be just as well camouflaged and vulnerable. When scared, a chick's instinct is often to stay quiet and avoid detection, so if you see an adult bird calling out in distress or trying to catch your attention, back away carefully to help protect nests from harm." Mike Shurmer, Head of Species for RSPB England.

The RSPB's conservation scientists have developed methods to help protect nesting birds from environmental threats including climate change, wildfire and sea level rise, which can be delivered through managing landscapes for wildlife. They have seen fantastic results for species including roseate tern and stone curlew, but to protect ground nesting birds across the countryside, everyone can play a part by watching where they step. 

BOROUGH



New Brighton open-air baths were opened by Viscount Leverhulme on the 13th of June 1934, they were considered the largest outdoor swimming pool in Europe. The pool could accommodate over 2,000 swimmers and 1,000 sunbathers/spectators - at the time it was considered a place to be seen, with many people driving there , using the newly opened Mersey Tunnel. Between June and September 1934 almost one million people went through the turnstiles!





This photograph was taken in 1910 - Tutty's Stores on the right hand side at numbers 17-21 Oxton Road, Birkenhead started trading here in 1904 until 1937 when Rostances took over until they closed in 1977. The Grand Hotel in Charing Cross can be seen in the background.



This is the original miller's cottage at the junction of what is now Mill Lane, Irby (right) and Hillbark Road (left). It was purchased by George and Bertha Lumsden in 1919 and this was taken when they opened it as The Old Mill Cafe and Stores. Known locally for many decades as Lumsden's Cafe; they held dances here two or three times a week. Higsons Brewery purchased the land and buildings in 1938 but couldn't get planning permission until the 1970's on the condition that the cottage should be saved and any extensions would be in keeping with the property. The Mill Pub opened in 1980.



MIGHT BITE by Patrick Foster Published by Bloomsbury Sport

Having a Flutter: Just on the National or a Daily Addiction?

In the past decade gambling has become a major element of "entertainment" for many people of all ages. For the vast majority, activities such as the National lottery, scratch cards, fixed odds betting, poker, horse racing, etc. are an occasional "flutter", however, evidence shows that an increasing number of "occasional punters", as high as 3 per cent of adults, bet more than they can afford. Concerns have been expressed about the pervasiveness of advertising promoting gambling, on television, the media, sporting journals and billboards, offering incentives to "get started", "keep spending", with free bets, money back, and 5th place payouts etc.



In a powerful, no holds barred and emotionally challenging book, "Might Bite" by Patrick Foster engages the reader in a lucid account of his roller coaster battle with gambling and personal struggles. With the support of his co-writer, Will Macpherson, Patrick highlights the ease by which he became "trapped" in a web of success and the "buzz of celebration", loss and the "secrecy of depression", traversing the pits of pathological addiction, loneliness and mental frustration. Those readers with personal experience, at primary or secondary participation, with the "highs and lows" endured by the author, will find this book makes for compelling and at times heart rending reading.

Patrick was no working class, underprivileged or emotionally deprived student seeking solace or attempting to boost his grant by "having a flutter". It is clear that his parents had encouraged and supported his development from the fee paying school at Oundle, to Durham University, training at the MCC Centre of Excellence for "aspiring cricketers" and playing as a professional cricketer for Northants. He openly concedes that having money was actually a problem. He had three incomes made up of a generous allowance from his parents, a salary from Northants Cricket and a student loan. His detailed reflection on how he became ensnared within the "gambling arena", resulting in personal battles with "debt and mental health" highlight issues which will make readers ponder and possibly "stop in their tracks".

He recalls how, as a student at Durham University at 19, he went to a Coral betting shop for the first time and was enthused by the "electric hub of activity". His initial winnings of £72 playing roulette on a Fixed Odds Betting Terminal gave him the "buzz for more action". Unlike his friends who left the Coral shop to do other things, Patrick turned back "into the action". He was hooked into the winning mindset and associated little bubble, based on the assumption that as an avid watcher, based on the

assumption that as an avid watcher, participant and his knowledge of sport could make him loads of money. He had won £70, why not turn it into £700. The buzz and elation, his success on his first day as a gambler drew him back regularly for "more and more action". His need to find time for regular gambling and socialising impacted negatively on his careers in cricket, insurance and teaching. As a result of his "secret life" as an isolated punter and considerable debts, he faced rejection, fear of failure and a personal crisis.

It is clearly evident that his personal reflection on why he was facing "failure and self doubt at 20" failed to deter his need for gambling as the closest thing he could find to "replicate and replace" the buzz of playing cricket. This "gambling buzz" became greater with higher stakes, more bets, particularly accumulators. Some readers may find his accounts of experiences emotionally disturbing. Being trapped in the buzz of gambling resulted in loneliness, boredom and incessant stress to hide the guilt of being a "secret addict" from family and colleagues. The reflective "situational analysis" by his wife Charlotte adds greatly to the content and relevance of the text. This is particularly evident when she comments on his secretive behaviour, on his phone both night and day, evidence of anxiety, at times inconsiderate, irrational and frustrating behaviour. She discusses her scepticism regarding his debts, and inability to accept his need for support and her feelings of guilt questioning him since he was so convincing with outstandingly generous and loving features.

Financial problems of debts to friends, colleagues, parents of pupils, loan companies and others reached a crescendo in March 2018. Despite winning about £58,000 on bets he was under constant pressure because his debts were £152,000. He had tracked a horse "Might Bite" and bet almost £50,000 for the horse to win the Cheltenham Gold Cup, earn him £200,000 and clear his debts.

Might Bite lost. This was the pit of emotional loneliness for Patrick. His response was standing on platform 5 at Slough station in a real personal mess, an emotional wreck and a broken person. His journey to self analysis, recognition of his role in the process of reform, and finding a new "buzz" were made possible by the support, care and acceptance by his wife Charlotte, his family, the Professional Cricketers' Association, colleagues and a period of specialist residential treatment

Patrick's emotionally challenging story addresses key issues affecting the growing numbers of "gambling addicts" very effectively. He highlights key issues including the need for bookmakers to re-assess advertising strategies to "entice" punters, the problems caused by excessive losses and research into mental health issues and suicides caused by gambling debts. Patrick is "in recovery", working with EPIC a gambling harm minimization group and an ambassador for enhancing personal skills in young people through participation in sport.






